SWEETPOTATO VALUE CHAIN

Sweetpotato(Ipomoea batatas)

An important staple and a food security crop in most parts of Africa.

- Uses
 - Eaten boiled or fried.
 - Used in the manufacture of syrup, alcohol and starch
 - When consumed corrects Vitamin A deficiency in children

Mostly cultivated in the Guinea and Coastal Savanna ecological zones in Ghana.

- Sanitized material are multiplied at three primary sites across the country for distribution to Secondary multipliers.

PROCESSING OF SWEETPOTATO

- A total of 115 women across the country have been trained in the processing of sweetpotato yoghurt called 'Potaghurt'
- 25 have further been supported to access the RTIMP's Micro Enterprise Fund to acquire processing and storage equipment.

MARKET SUPPORT

- Further support to the improve packaging of potaghurt and attract more customers is on the way.
- Processing groups in Cape Coast and Navrongo will soon be supported to set up marketing outlets to boost sales.

EXPORT OPPORTUNITIES

- The programme has signed an agreement with an off-taker who requires 24 metric tons of fresh sweetpotato per week for export.
 - Variety Required
 - Beauregard (Orange Flesh Sweetpotato)

Beauregard Primary Multiplication

- Purchase 10,000 sterilised vines of Orange flesh sweetpotato from BINARI which are currently being multiplied at
 - Okyereko
 - Asuansi

Secondary and Tertiary Multiplication.

- Selected farmers from
 - Gomoa East District,
 - Gomoa West District
 - Cape Coast Municipal
 - Techiman Municipalare being prepared to roll out the activities

Financing

Tripartite Agreement

- Between Farmer, PFI and Off-taker/guarantor
 - The Farmer/Borrower agrees to sell (for the season) sweetpotato roots from his farm to the offtaker/exporter
 - The off-taker/guarantor gives prior information on the quantities of raw roots required, price to be offered and how to arrive at it, as well as time to deliver it.

The Farmer/Borrower opens and maintain an account at the Rural Bank and submit to the credit rules of the PFI in the appropriation of the said facility.

 Disbursement of funds to the farmer by the PFI will be made to the supply source of inputs and services with the prior knowledge of the offtaker/guarantor

- The PFI shall explicitly declare and explain all terms and conditions for lending to the other parties to the agreement especially interest rates, disbursement procedures, repayment terms, etc.
- The PFI liaises with the Processor /Guarantor to monitor the day-to-day operations of the farmer throughout the season and report to RTIMP to offer any other support they may require

Price Determination

The Open Book System will be employed
 To promote Transparency, Trust and Enforcement.

Terms of Repayment

- The Farmer/Borrower shall agree that payments for the sale of roots supplied to the off-taker will be lodged in their bank accounts with the PFI.
- The Farmer shall agree for the total loan repayment to be made against the total proceeds from the sale of roots supplied to the offtaker/guarantor

Object

- Empowering farmers to increase their yield per acre and provide him/her with ready market
- Attract a lot of farmers to take up the cultivation of the beauregard.

Way Forward

- RTIMP is planning a programme with WIAD to introduce some new Sweetpotato recipes across the country.
- Discussions are being concluded with some selected
 District Assemblies to introduce sweetpotato meals in their School Feeding Programme.
